




WebQuest Introductory Level -Fossil Fools

INTRODUCTION

What are Fossil Fuels and Are we becoming Fossil Fools because of our actions.



The most popular fossil fuels that we use every day are coal, oil, and natural gas. Fossil fuels are made from deceased and decayed plants and animals that were buried hundreds of millions of years ago. When we burn fossil fuels, harmful chemicals such as carbon dioxide, methane and nitrogen are released into the air that damage the earth's atmosphere. This contributes to global warming. The burning of fossil fuels and how we use them causes what is known as the 'greenhouse effect'.

We use fossil fuels to provide 80% of the world's energy. This is a huge percentage and means that today we are still very dependent on this type of fuel to create electricity. Not only do fossil fuels release harmful chemicals, we also only have a limited supply of them on the earth as they are non-renewable sources of energy.

However, do not despair, all is not lost. The way forward is to switch to renewable sources of energy such as wind, water, and solar energy. These types of energy are in infinite supply, reduce air pollution and greenhouse gases – this will protect our planet.

You have learned how fossil fuels contribute to global warming and now you want to make a difference.

You think it would be great to tell others in your school how important it is to make little changes to our daily activities that can combat climate change and reduce our fossil fuel consumption. You want to look after the planet and encourage others to do the same.

Firstly, you need to find out facts and information about how people can make small changes that will lower their carbon footprint. You hope that this will help your school and even members within your community to make a difference to help the planet.

To get the message out and to spread the word, you will create a poster that you can hang up in your school to show the teachers and students how they can help the planet.

In this WebQuest, you will follow the steps below helping you and your classmates to learn about fossil fuels and how they affect the environment. You will make the poster working in small groups of 2 or 3 students. At the end, you can present your poster to your school and encourage others to



















make a *big* difference through *small* actions. You hope that this will help others to discover ways that they can start to make a change. Let's get started!

PROCESS

Step 1: Finding the Facts and Figures

To begin, think about all the information, pictures, and interesting facts that you want to include in your poster. You need to make sure that you mention what fossil fuels are and how they are bad for the planet.






EVALUATION
